# Vocabulary

1. jeopardise (v) – to put something in danger of being harmed or damaged
2. safety (n) – “safe” is the adj, “save” is the verb
3. scarcely (adj) – almost not
4. stringency (n) – a situation in which a law, test, etc. is extremely severe
5. rarity (n) – something that is very unusual (“rare” (adj))
6. halt (v) – stop, pause
7. confusion (n) – a situation in which people do not understand what is happening (“confuse” (v))
8. fiasco (n) - a complete failure (in an embarrassing way)

- ..... without regard for ..... (not paying attention to)

e.g. Numerous cases of cheating in the public exam **highlight the need** for a review of the assessment policies.

e.g. We cannot succeed in the DSE **without regard for** the importance of hard work and skills.
